Hello again brothers and sisters, I hope this finds you well. I write these messages about two weeks before they actually come out so it's still the middle of the holiday season. As we were running errands the other day I heard an old Garth Brooks song on the radio, "The Change." The song is about how one good deed, an act of faith, helping someone

in need, changes not the world, but keeps us from being changed by the world. NOMINATIONS FOR OFFICERS

Attention all members in good standing. This message is to notify you of our upcoming elections for the 2025-26 Lodge year. If you would like to become an officer, please read the following section from our Local Lodge By-laws. <u>Nominations are being taken now for the</u> <u>Port Huron Elks Lodge #343 2025-2026 Officers. Nominations will be closed after Monday, February 10th Lodge meeting. Voting will take place Monday, February 24th at the Lodge meeting.</u>

ARTICLE VII NOMINATION, ELECTION, AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. Nominations for offices to be filled at the annual election in Lodges shall be made in the order in which they appear in Section 2 of Article VII of the Constitution of the Order at any regular meeting of the Lodge on or after the 1st day of January if meetings are held monthly, or otherwise after the 1st day of February and prior to the date of the annual election. If no nomination for a particular office shall have been made prior to the date of such election, or if all candidates previously nominated for a particular office shall have declined or withdrawn, nominations for that office may be made on the date of election. If a Member has been nominated for more than one office, they must declare that they accept one nomination and withdraw from the other nomination before the close of the last regular meeting of the Lodge prior to the regular meeting at which the election is to be held, and if they do not do so, they must accept only the first nomination. No Member, unless nominated in accordance with this Section, shall be eligible to election at any such annual election. Only a Member in good standing shall be eligible for nomination to office in the Lodge of which they are a Member.

LEGACY SCHOLARSHIPS FOR ELK MEMBERS CHILDREN & GRANDCHILDREN

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. The 2024 application closes on February 2, 2025 at 11:59 a.m. PST.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE:

For the 2025 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2021, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2021, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2025. Great-grandchildren are not eligible. The applicant must be a high school senior.

The applicant must apply online only. The 2025 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 2, 2025, 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.

Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.

Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Guam, Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)

If you are selected as a 2025 Legacy Awards recipient, you will be required to perform three instances of service with an Elks Lodge during the four years you are receiving the scholarship.
