While driving home from work on October 9, 2024, Brian suffered a "widow maker" heart attack, which caused a stroke, brain injury. Following emergency surgery, he had 9 months of hospitalization, brain and cardiac rehab, then specialized brain training. Severe memory loss wiped out aspects of his life. He did not know people, events, foods. With neurological brain training he relearned basic living skills like eating and drinking, speech, and fine motor skills, before being released to his mother's care in June. He continues many doctors, therapy, and counseling appointments to aid in his recovery.
