Luckily for us we have Club 343, two committees and a counsel that have taken up the torch. Queen of Hearts is back! Every Friday night for the next 40 weeks we will have the Q of H drawings on Friday nights. Please come out have some dinner and drinks, buy some tickets, and pick up some to sell also. The proceeds of this drawing will go to help pay for our new golf cart fleet. Next the Entertainment Committee has a multitude of great events planned. If you missed going "Elking", or the News Years Eve party you missed out on two awesome events where everyone had a great time. Please check in on Facebook to see their coming events.
